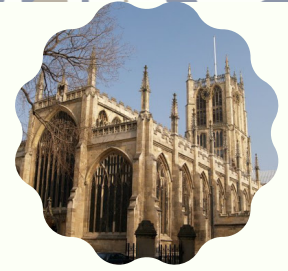

WHAT DOES HULL MEAN TO ME?



Maths

Our main areas of study will be:

- Place Value
- Reading and writing numbers up to 1000
- Counting in 50's
- Written addition and subtraction methods with 2 and 3 digit numbers

We will be focusing on 3, 4 and 8 times tables as well as consolidating 2, 5 and 10's. Your support at home will be greatly appreciated with helping your child learn their times tables.

Literacy

Our main areas of study will be:

- Narrative writing focusing on fairy tales
- Character and scene descriptions
- Myths and Legends
- Instruction writing.

We will be recapping Phase 5 and 6 Phonics as well as daily grammar lessons.

Science

In Science we will be covering 'Animals including Humans'. For this topic we will be finding out about the human body and how we differ from other mammals. Your child's learning will be supported through practical activities and investigations.

PSHE

In PSHE we will be focusing on 'Life after Covid'. This will cover feelings about returning to school, reconnecting with others and having a positive attitude to learning. We will also look at Being Me in My World.

R.E.

In R.E. we will be focusing on the meaning and messages within different Bible stories.

Computing/French

In computing we will be focusing on E-Safety and the use of Google Classroom that they can use to help their learning at home. In Key Stage 2, all children will have the opportunity to learn French taught by a specialist language teacher.

Art/DT

As part of our topic, we will be focusing on sketching famous landmarks from Hull in the style of local artist, David Hockney.

History/Geography

In Geography we will be focusing on developing our map reading skills, in relation to where Hull is in the world. We will also be producing a presentation on why we should be proud to be from Hull. In History, we shall look at the History of Hull and research key events.

PE

PE kits should be brought into school every Monday and taken home to be washed every Friday. PE lessons will usually take place on Monday afternoons. Children will need their PE kit of plain red shorts, or plain black jogging bottoms and a plain white T Shirt. Trainers are also required on this day, as wherever possible, PE lessons will take place outside. Please ensure your child's kit is clearly labelled with their name.

Home Reading

Reading books will be sent home every Monday and should be returned to school to be changed every Friday. They should be encouraged to read a few pages or a chapter every night. Please discuss with your child what they've read before signing their reading record. Books need to be brought to school every day. All children are entered into the class reading challenge where they need to read at least 5 books

Homework/Spellings

Homework and spellings will be set on Mondays. A short spelling test and times table test will be carried out the following Monday. Children will have a week to return their completed homework.
